The exhibition of the world-renown Czech photographer Josef Sudek, organized in the year of his 120<sup>th</sup> anniversary of birth (1896) and 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of death (1976), presents photographs of Prague-based artists' studios in the form of authorial newprints from Sudek's original negatives borrowed from the collection of the Institute of Art History of the CAS.

For the exhibition "Josef Sudek: In the Studio," the Gallery of Science and Art of the CAS presents 57 photographs, selected at the discretion of the exhibition's curators, depicting the studios of ten

Prague-based artists whose work Sudek systematically documented. Apart from the well-known studios of the sculptors Bohumil Kafka, Josef Wagner, Josef Mařatka and Hana Wichterlová we can also see the studio of the painter Andrej Bělocvětov who was a close friend of Sudek's, or Ota Janeček who also shared a close relationship with him. The studio spaces of other, lesser known artists will also be presented, as Sudek in fact often had much sympathy for them. These include sculptor Jiří Jaška, painters František Zikmund, Vilém Plocek and Emanuel Famíra.

In 1978 Anna Fárová, at the behest of the photographer's sister Božena Sudková, brought over 13 000 negatives of the photographer's work to the Institute of Art History of the CAS. One of the largest files of the commercially-oriented part of Sudek's work are the negatives of paintings, illustrations and sculptures of almost 800 artists. Apart from the reproductions of art works, the collection in some cases offers views into the artists' studios, as well as portraits of the artists themselves who worked in these studio spaces.

The selected series of the studio photographs is poised on the border of Sudek's free and commercial work. It contains many personal stories of the artists as well as the photographer, and in this way offers a peculiar documentary comparison with the well-known setting of Sudek's own art studio as well as his garden at Újezd. It at the same time thematizes the intimate, and often mysterious, spirit of the space in which a painting, a sculpture, a drawing or, in Sudek's case, a photograph is born.

The studio images have survived only in the form of negatives and the exhibited photographs are thus not the original positives but so-called newprints – that is new, silver bromide photographs from Josef Sudek's original negatives, made in 2016 by photographer Vlado Bohdan in the dark room of the Art History Department of the AS CR. The newprints were created by means of contact prints in the negatives' original sizes (13x18 or 10x15 cm).

#### The exhibition will be accompanied by a published catalogue with texts by Vojtěch Lahoda.

The exhibition is organized by the Institute of Art History of the CAS.as part of the project entitled "Josef Sudek and the Photographic Documentation of Art Works: from Personal Archive to the Representation of Cultural Heritage (2016 – 2020)," supported by the Ministry of Culture of CR, v.v.i. as part of the NAKI II program.
